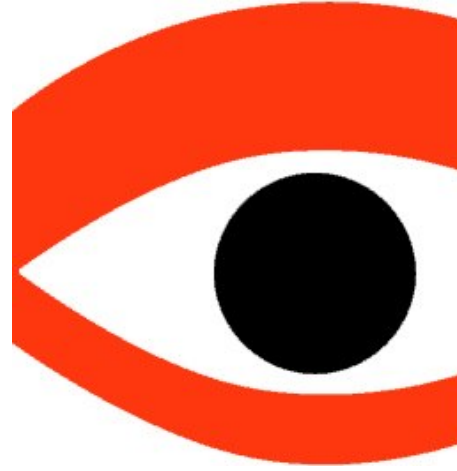


NORTHWEST FILM FORUM SEEKING NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

ENJOY FREE, LOCAL MUSIC DOWNTOWN THIS SUMMER

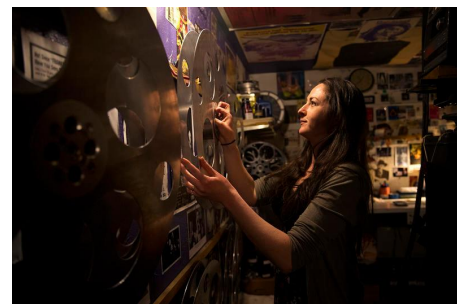
